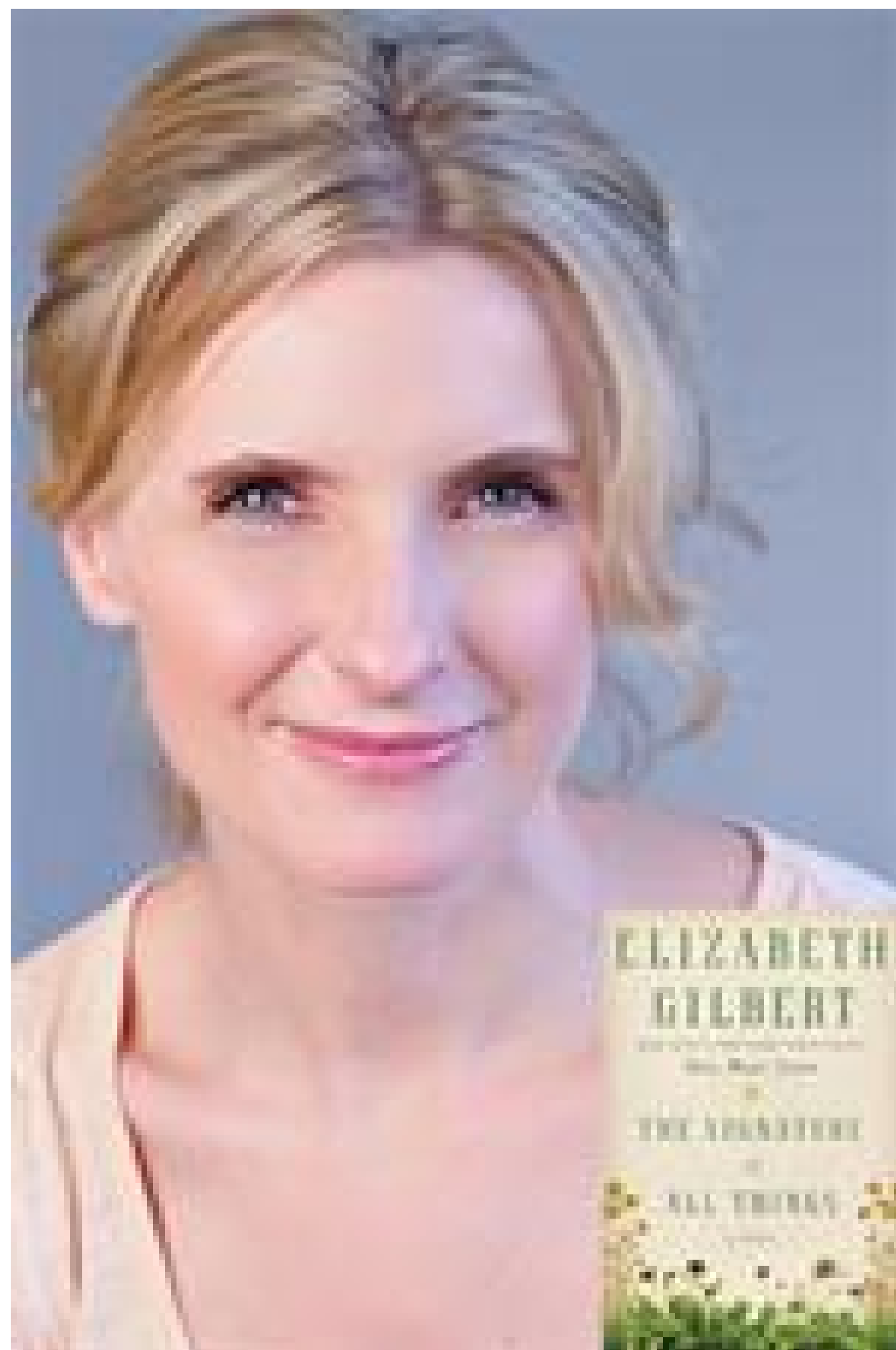

Elizabeth Gilbert is the acclaimed author of five books of fiction and nonfiction. Her short story collection, *Pilgrims*, was a finalist for the PEN/Hemingway Award, and her novel, *Stern Men*, was a New York Times Notable Book. Her 2002 book, *The Last American Man*, was a finalist for both the National Book Award and the National Book Critics Circle Award. She is best known for her 2006 memoir, *Eat, Pray, Love*, which has been published in more than thirty languages; a film based on the memoir, starring Julia Roberts, opened in August 2010. Her most recent work, *Committed* – a memoir of marriage – was a # 1 New York Times bestseller. In 2008, Time magazine named Gilbert one of the most influential people in the world.
