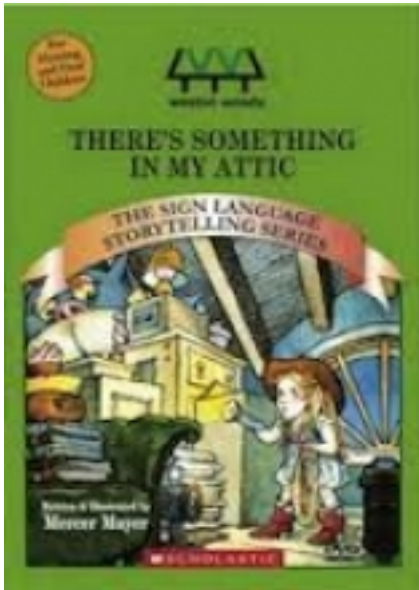




There's Something In My Attic
