This is a landmark attraction in the Dells, because it is the only exploration on Earth where you can touch and feel the original Russian Space Station MIR Core Module - something that I found especially interesting after visiting The Museum of Cosmonautics, Moscow. It is amazing to have a part in the Russian space program here in Wisconsin. You can also enjoy VR adventures, holograms and puzzles. Also, you can ride the thinnest bicycle trail in the world (a 12-foot cable suspended 12 feet above the ground).
