**Location:**

Classes will be held at Bridges, located at 935 Edgehill Avenue near downtown Nashville.

**Directions:**

**From 65 NORTH:** Take exit 81 for Wedgewood Avenue. Turn RIGHT onto Wedgewood Avenue. Turn RIGHT onto 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue South. Turn LEFT onto Edgehill Avenue. Bridges is on the LEFT on Edgehill Avenue.

**From 65 SOUTH:** Take exit 81 for Wedgewood Avenue. Turn LEFT onto Wedgewood Avenue. Turn RIGHT onto 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue South. Turn LEFT onto Edgehill Avenue. Bridges is on the LEFT on Edgehill Avenue.

**Parking:**

Parking is available at Bridges in the marked spaces only. Please do not park in the circle drive or along the grass. Additional parking is available at the church next door.

The purpose of this class is to teach the skills needed for optimal lip reading and provide practice for those individuals wanting to improve their lip reading skills. Students should understand the importance of practice outside of class in order to gain the maximum benefit from the instruction.

Many people use lip reading to help fill in the gaps of what they miss with the hearing they have. Others who have no residual or aided hearing can use lip reading to gain information from communication partners who do not use sign language.

Nearly everyone relies on lip reading at times. Individuals with hearing loss can work on improving their lip reading skills in order to minimize frustration and communication breakdowns.
